To prevent any confusion, it was decided that changes would only be accepted that have been submitted on the "Meeting List Change Form" readily available at the office or on line. Changes can no longer just be phoned into the office, scribbled on a scrap of paper or sent in by eMail.

This form is really quite simple and self-explanatory, but does need to be filled out completely, including a contact name and phone number, other wise it will not be processed.

A recent example also proved the need of proof reading before submitting. This form was turned into the office on 8/10/06, listed all the meeting times across the board ,indicated "No changes" (they just wanted to up-date the "Last Updated" notation on their listing). Only problem, there was no Town, Group Name or even Mtg Facility indicated.

Okay, so I'll go the extra mile and call the person who submitted the form and check. Go down to the "Telephone #" and find "897" for the phone number, unfortunately my phone company does require more than just three digits to complete a phone call.
