# From the Chair:

Dear Friends.

Have you ever struggled with prayer? I certainly have (and still do at times). When I came into Alcoholics Anonymous, the only prayers I really knew were prayers like: "Oh God, if you just help me this one last time, I promise I'll never drink again"; "Please, let the bootlegger still be open"; and my all-time favorite, "God, please don't let me wake up again, I just can't live like this anymore".

When I came into AA, I didn't know how or what to pray for, so I began with small prayers like, "God, please help me not to drink today"; "Please remove the obsession"; Please help me to stay in the moment"; "Please help me keep my mouth shut".

Today I know the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous is filled with many prayers. For a daily prayer I can go to (85:2): Help me to carry the vision of Your will into all my activities. How can I best serve Thee? Thy will not mine be done. When I need direction (13:4): Father grant me direction and strength to meet my problems as you would have them. When I have doubt (87:3): Please give me the right thought or action. When I have fear (68:3): Lord remove my fear and direct my attention to what you would have me be.

Any communion I have with my Higher Power is a prayer. Sometimes, all I need to do is to **STOP & LISTEN**.

#### From the Treasurer

From the Treasurer- Prudent Reserve, Part 2

Last month we talked about Intergroup's prudent reserve, a fund set up to buffer against the unexpected or unusually large demands on our financial resources. The question remains: How large should a reserve fund should be?

The circumstances and needs of a small home group will not be the same as those of a larger group. The same is true for service committees. Each must consider its own unique needs and expectations.

What has been the trend of contributions? What about expenses? Most groups will at least need to consider things like rent, supplies, and literature. Many also will want to consider funds for supporting the activities of an Intergroup Rep and GSR, and to have a little left over to support AA service activities beyond the home group. Do the last few months reflect a complete picture, or do we need to look back further to get a good perspective on group finance?

Once income and expenses have been assessed, the group can then decide how much to set aside. Where no extraordinary expenses are anticipated, many home groups have decided two to three months combined expenses is a good reserve amount. For service committees, a larger reserve may be needed in order to assure sustained activity, particularly if the committee regularly hosts money-intensive activities like conferences or breakfasts involving contract guarantees. It should also be noted that some groups maintain no reserve at all, either out of necessity (there just isn't enough money coming in to set anything aside) or plan.

I hope this information will be helpful as we continue to discuss the management of Intergroup's reserve resources. As was mentioned last month, our by-laws set a cap on our reserve, but no target level.

In related matters, Nassau remains fortunate to be well supported by local groups and members. Please remember to place your group's NIG number—found to the right of your group's name in the meeting list—on all contributions and inquiries.

It is my pleasure to try to answer any questions you may have, and to assist your group in any way. Just ask.
